The RLFS is an interactive, realistic, immediately usable presentation of the basic principles and traits of tried-and-true traditional leadership and attendance is open to anyone interested. The essential linkage of leader vision, strategy, planning and constantly monitored and adjusted leadership execution. Additionally, RLFS covers leadership under stress for both young leaders, and explains how Rangers prepare to lead under the extreme stress of combat.
