Mission

Train, develop and inspire tomorrow's Warriors for our Nation's Armed Forces.

After-School Career Education Program

The Military Explorers operate as an after school full-time year-round Career Education Program. Depending on the category of training, Units meet after school weekly or bi-weekly, and possible at times on some Saturdays. This depends on the Courses and available Instructor time. The Explorers operate under the auspices of the Exploring Division of Learning for Life, Inc., a career-based education training organization for young adults. There are three (3) options of Military Exploring Programs with time frame variances.

Officer Corps Preparatory Program (Full Time Program)

Highly academic oriented, young adults in this Officer Preparatory program usually pursue a goal of entering one of the U.S. Service Academies, receiving an ROTC Scholarship, or work on increasing their academic preparation for Enlistment into Military Service. In addition, this program follows strict guidelines to produce a cadet with superior skills in leadership, time management, public speaking within specific military protocol, with consideration of other military options in career progression toward a 20-yr military career. This Immersion Training is paramount to the success in this program. This option also includes training in a specific Career Field Track Training such as Airmanship, Special Operations, Intelligence, Infantry, Military Police, Armored Maintenance or Surface Warfare (Locations vary as to CFT's available)

Enlisted Corps Preparatory Program (Full or Part Time Program)

The majority of Explorer Unit in the U.S. conduct an Enlisted Corps Preparatory Program. This is geared for the Young adults with a goal of pursuing a military career encompassing more direct influence with Enlistment into the Armed Forces. This program initiates training with Basic Military Education skills such as: Military Drill, Military Comm Skills, Customs & Courtesies, Branch Weapon systems, Personal Development. The program then offers the young adult the opportunity to focus on the Non-Commissioned Officer (NCO) and Senior NCO (SNCO) area of professional development.

For those cadets staying in the area after High School, or junior college, they are provided advanced military leadership training into the SNCO ranks depending and are expected to lead and perform at the local, state, and regional areas as defined by HQ USMX CMD. Some options may include the Career Field Track Training as seen above in Officer Corps but may not be available at all locales. Other considerations are resource accessibility, manpower availability, along with time constraints per training cycle make this program demanding and challenging at the same time.

Military Club Program (Part Time for 6th, 7th & 8th Graders)

Young teens in Middle School are exposed to a specific service branch host unit USMX program to allow them to consider a military career option. The Club educates the teen on all branches of the U.S. Military to expose them to a wide range of options, career fields, and branch differences. This in turn makes the student look at all the available possibilities in a military career.

Introduction to U.S. National Security issues along with a global intelligence perspective give students a look inside our military seeing the ever-increasing issues they must consider before joining the military. Each Club is tailored to the ability of the Host Military Explorer Unit to provide specialty based military education and training within certain available parameters.
